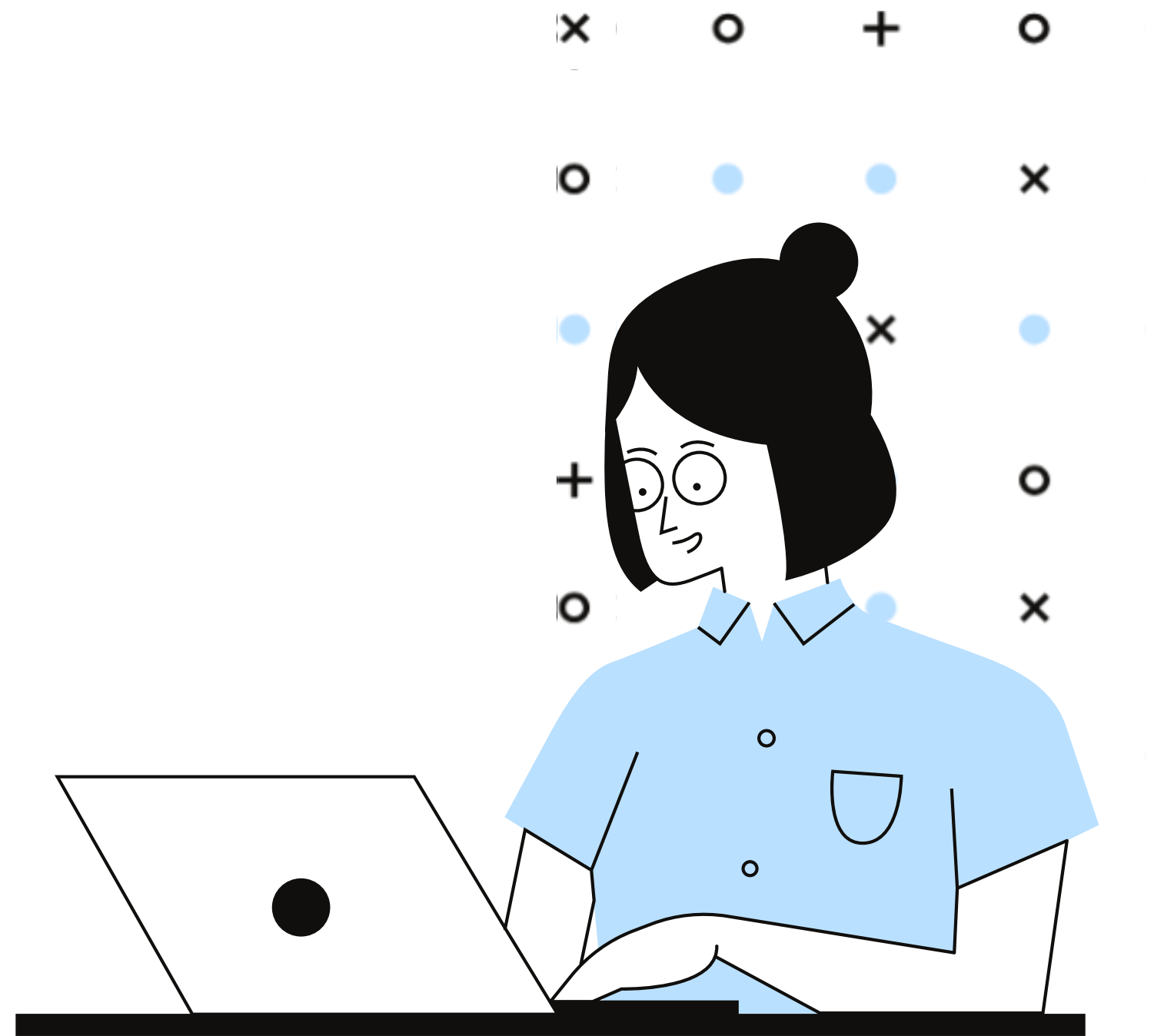


Why Learn English Grammar?

Parts of Speech

Nouns: Words that name people, places, things, or ideas.

Pronouns: Words that replace nouns.

Verbs: Words that express actions or states of being.

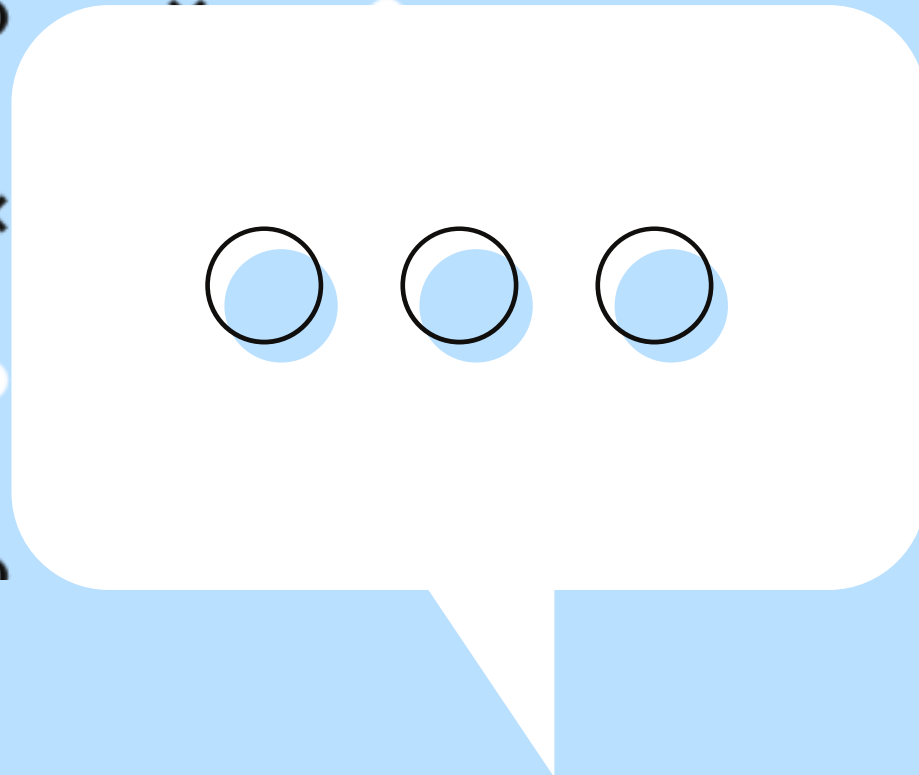
Adjectives: Words that describe nouns.

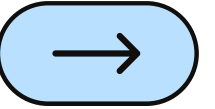
Adverbs: Words that modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs.

Prepositions: Words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence.

Conjunctions: Words that join words or groups of words.

Interjections: Words that express strong emotion

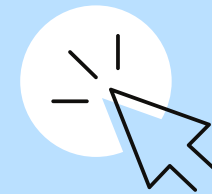
Verb Tenses



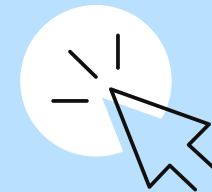
Understanding Verb Tenses



Present Simple: "She writes every day."



Past Simple: "He walked to the store."



Future Simple: "They will visit tomorrow."

Articles and Determiners

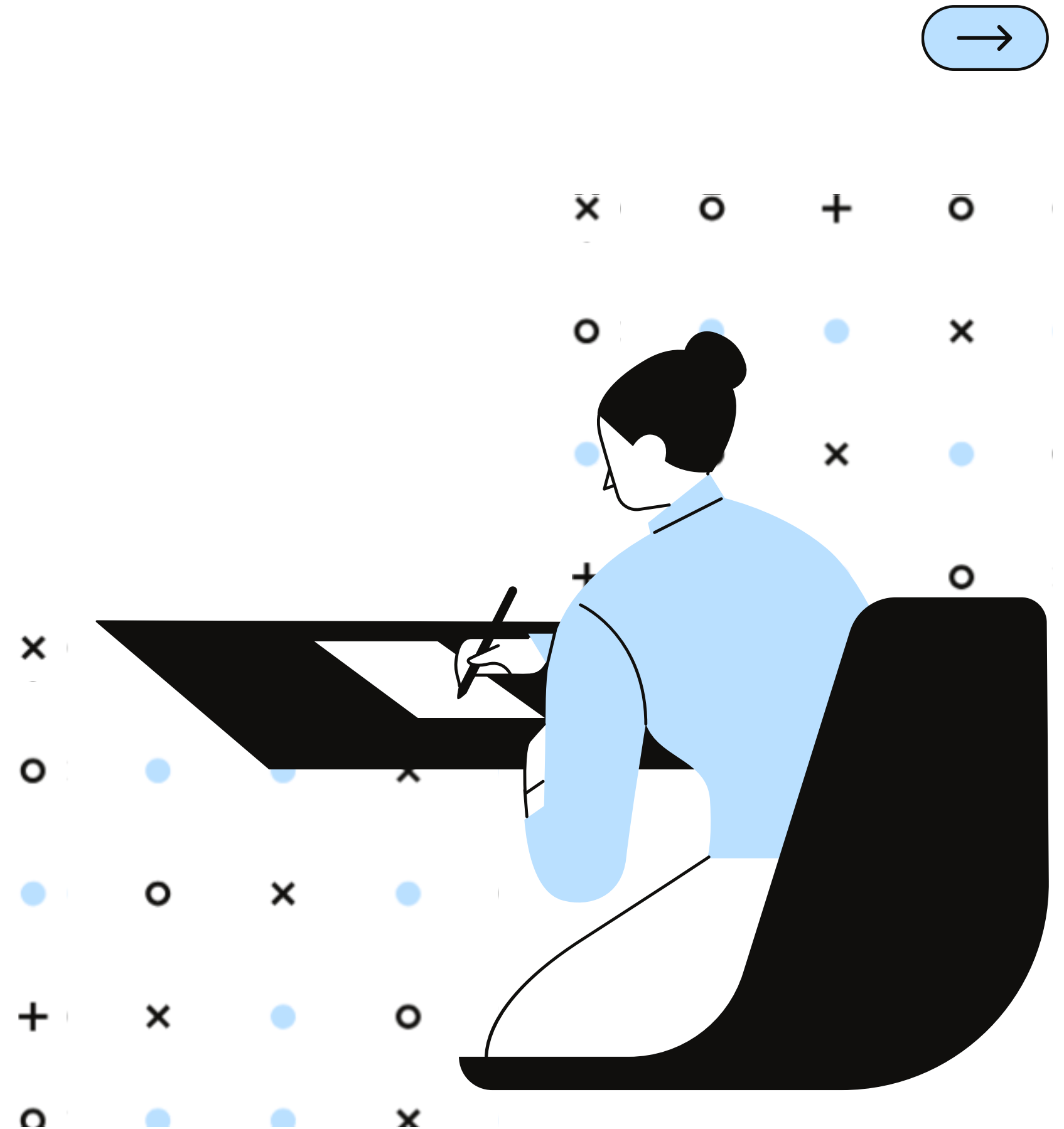
- **Definite Article: "the"**

"I saw the movie." (specific movie)

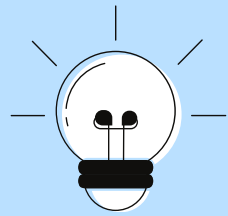
- **Indefinite Articles: "a", "an"**

"I want an apple." (any apple)

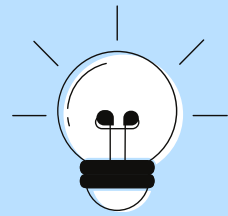
- **Determiners: Words like "this", "that", "these", "those", "my", "your", "each", "every", "some", "any".**



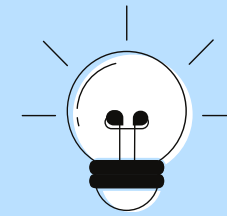

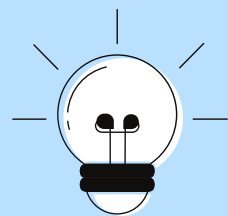
Mixing up "your" and

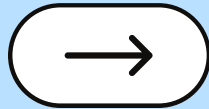

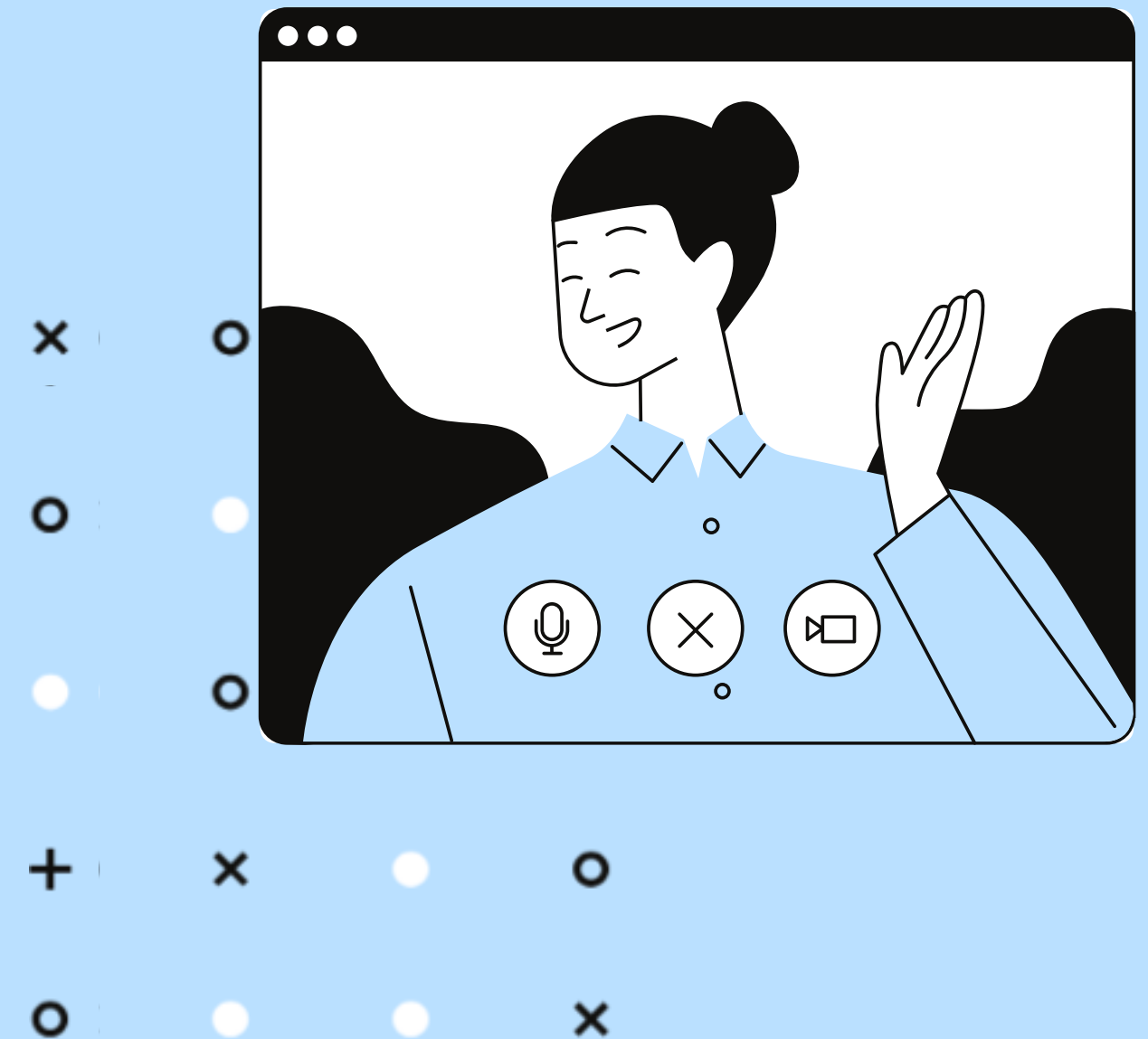
