Conditionals

ZERO CONDITTTIONAL

- WE USE THE ZERO CONDITIONAL TO EXPRESS CONDITIONS THAT ARE GOING TO BE 100% REAL.
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- EXAMPLE: IF YOU HEAT WATER AT 100 DEGREES, IT BOILS.
- STRUCTURE:
- IF+PRESENT SIMPLE, PRESENT SIMPLE



FIRST CONDITIONAL

WE USE THE FIRST CONDITIONAL TO EXPRESS SITUATIONS THAT COULD BE 50% REAL. AND IT GOING TO HAPPEN IN A SHORT FUTURE.

EXAMPLE: IF IT'S SUNNY, WE WILL GO TO THE PARK.

STRUCTURE:

IF +PRESENT SIMPLE, FUTURE SIMPLE

SECOND CONDITIONAL

- WE USE THE SECOND CONDITIONAL TO EXPRESS CONDITIONS THAT COULD HAPPEN WITH A PAST CONDITION. USUALLY ARE IMAGINARY SITUATIONS.
- EXAMPLE: IF I WON A MILLION EUROS, I WOULD BUY A NEW HOUSE.
- STRUCTURE: IF+PAST SIMPLE, PRESENT CONDITIONAL



THIRD CONDITIONAL

The third conditional, also known as the past unreal conditional, is a grammatical structure used in English to talk about unreal or hypothetical situations in the past. It describes a condition that did not happen in the past and its imagined result. Here's the general structure:

EXAMPLE: If she had studied harder, she would have passed the exam

STRUCTURE: If + past perfect (had + past participle), would have + past participle



MIXED CONDITIONALS

LET'S CHECK THIS MIXED CONDITIONALS IN THE NEXT LESSON BUT AN EXAMPLE IS:

IF I HAD LISTENED TO YOUR ADVICE, I WOULDN'T BE IN THIS MESS

STRUCTURE: IF+PAST PERFECT, PRESENT CONDITIONAL
