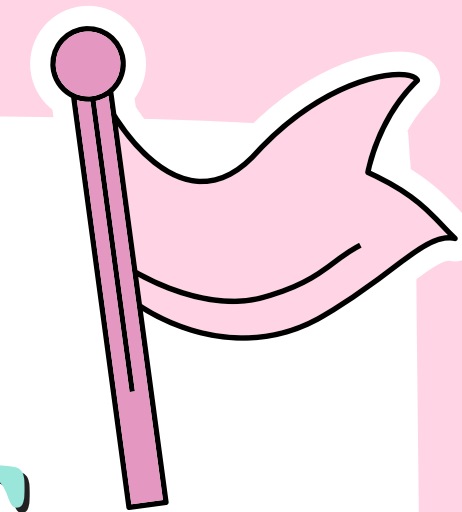
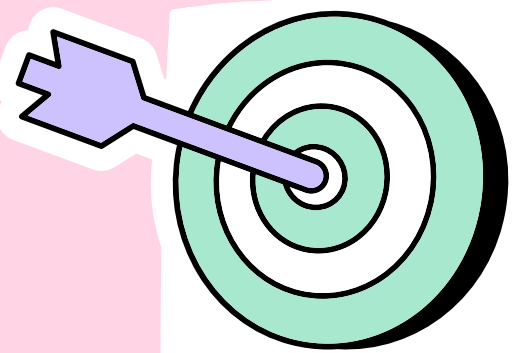




WHAT ARE PREPOSITIONS?

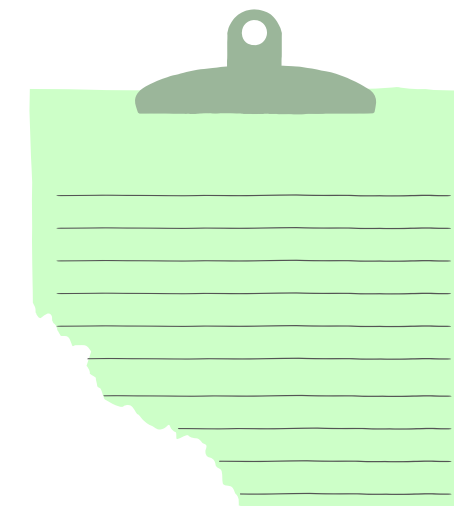
- ✦ Definition: Prepositions are small words that show relationships between other words in a sentence.
- ✦ Importance: Prepositions are essential for understanding the relationship between words in a sentence.
- ✦ Objective: To learn prepositions of place, direction, and time, and how to use them correctly in English.
- ✦ Example: In the sentence "The cat is on the table," "on" is the preposition indicating the cat's location.





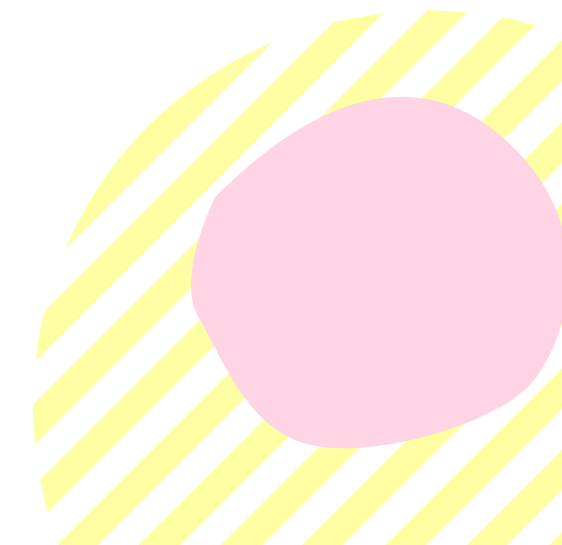
PREPOSITION OF PLACE

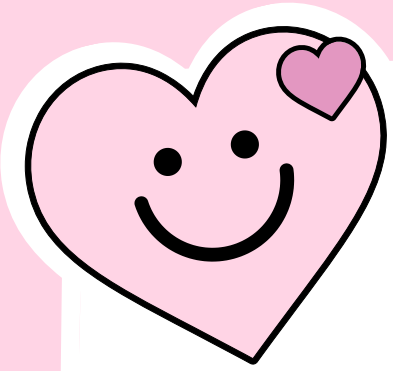
- ✦ Prepositions of place are used to describe the location of people, objects, or places in relation to other people, objects, or places. Here's how and when to use prepositions of place:



PREPOSITIONS

- In: inside a limited area ("I am in the house.")
- On: surface ("The book is on the table.")
- At: specific point ("She is waiting at the bus stop.")
- By: near ("He is standing by the car.")





PREPOSITIONS OF DIRECTION

- ✦ Prepositions of direction are used to indicate the movement or direction of someone or something in relation to another person, place, or thing. Here's how to use prepositions of direction correctly:

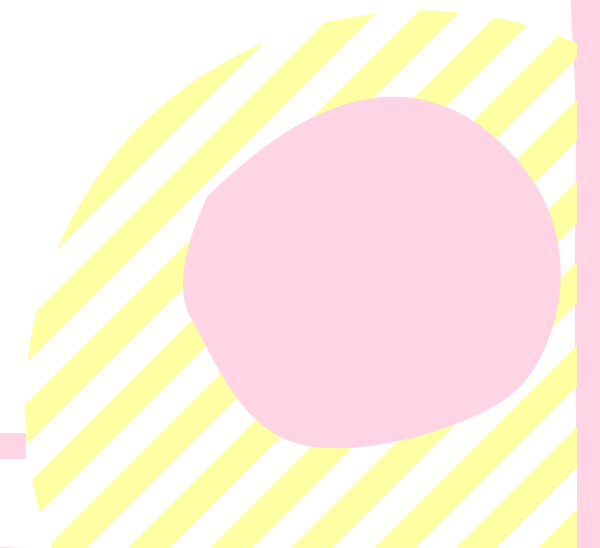
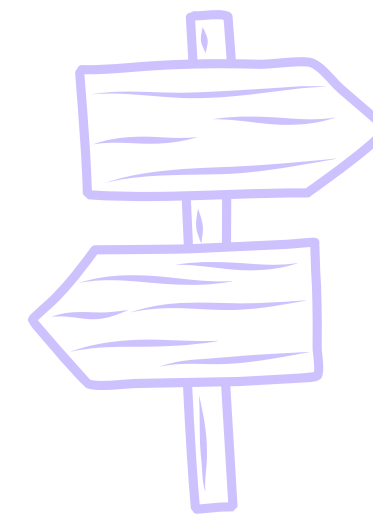

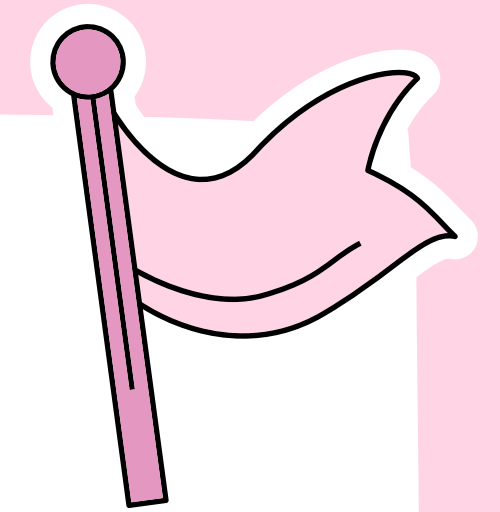
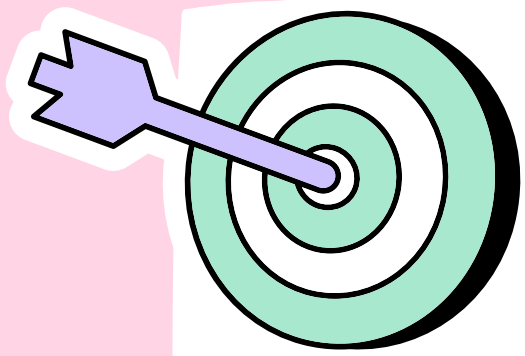
To: Movement toward a place ("He is going to the store.")

From: Movement away from a place ("She is coming from the office.")

Across: From one side to the other ("They walked across the bridge.")

Through: From one end to the other ("He drove through the tunnel.")



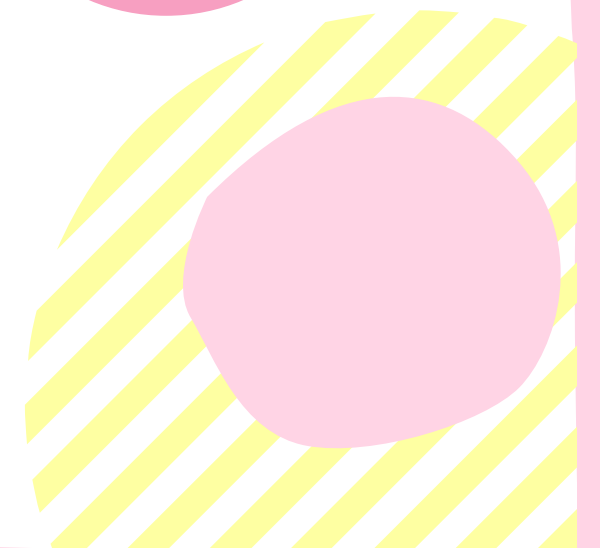
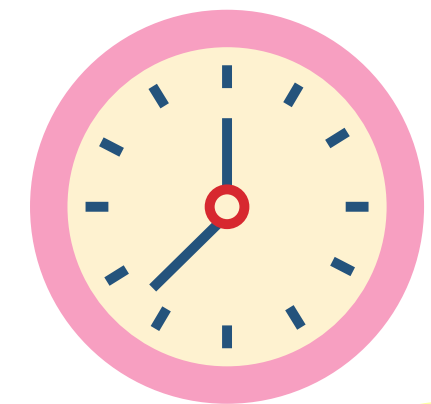


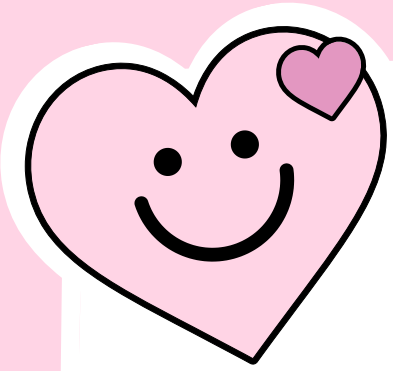
PREPOSITION OF TIME

✦ Prepositions of time are words that show the relationship between events or actions and a specific time. They help us understand when something happens in relation to a certain point in time. Here's how to use prepositions of time correctly:

PREPOSITIONS

- In: Months, years, centuries, or parts of the day ("We will meet in July.")
- On: Days and dates ("The party is on Saturday.")
- At: Specific times ("The meeting is at 3 PM.")
- For: Duration of time ("She studied for two hours.")
- Since: Starting point of an action in the past ("He has lived here since 2010.")





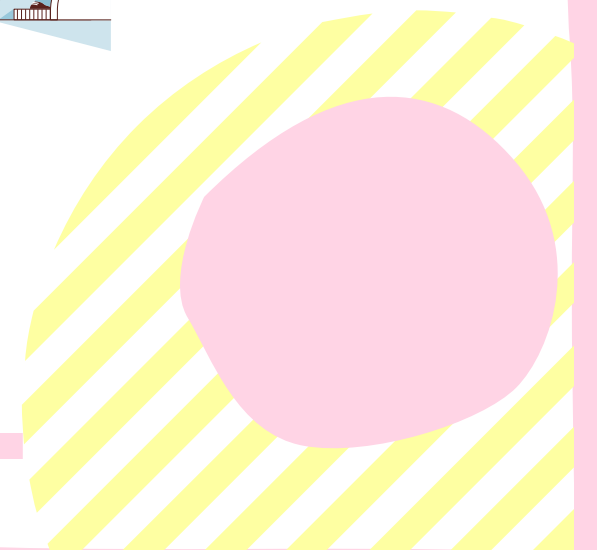
PREPOSITIONS OF TRANSPORT

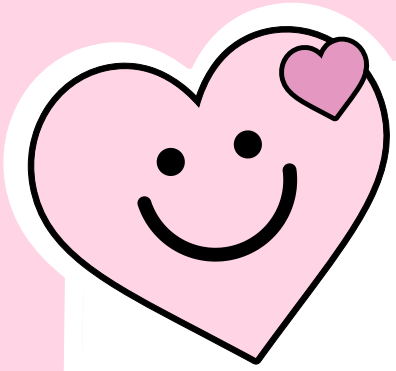
- ✦ Prepositions of transport are used to describe the relationship between people or objects and the mode of transportation they are using. These prepositions indicate where someone or something is in relation to a vehicle or a means of transport. Here's how to use prepositions of transport correctly:

PREPOSITIONS

By:

- Usage: "By" is used to indicate the mode of transportation.
- Examples: "She travels by car." "They came here by train."





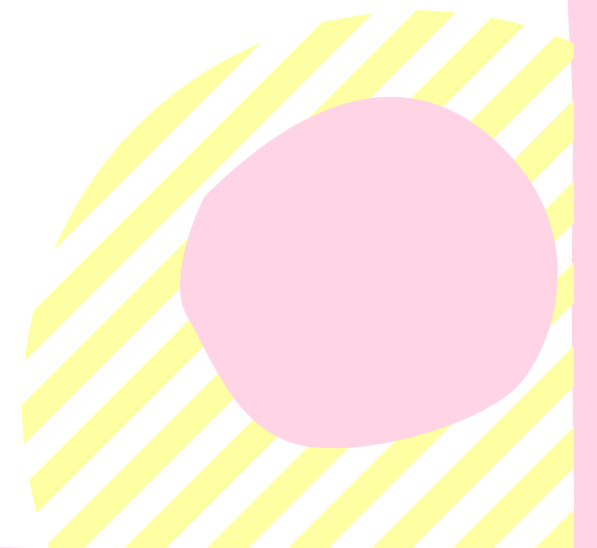
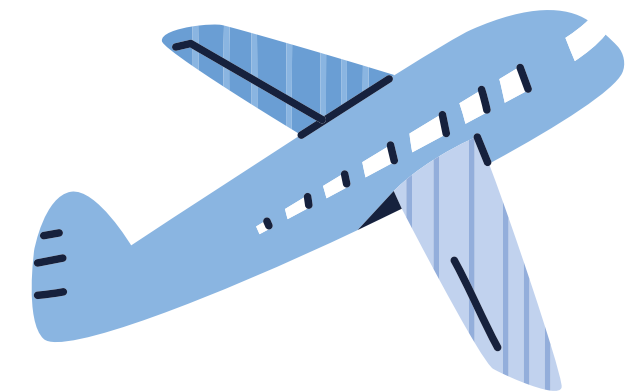
PREPOSITIONS OF TRANSPORT

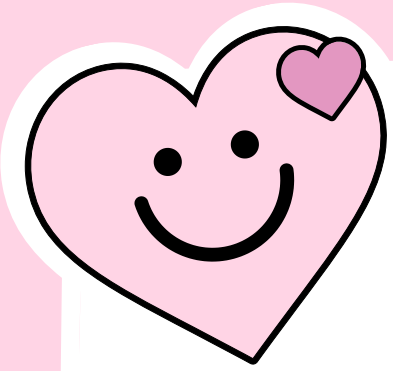
On:

- Usage: "On" is used for public transportation or when you are a passenger in a vehicle.
- Examples: "I go to work on the bus." "She is on the plane."

In:

- Usage: "In" is used for private vehicles where you sit inside.
- Examples: "They are traveling in a taxi." "We are in a boat."





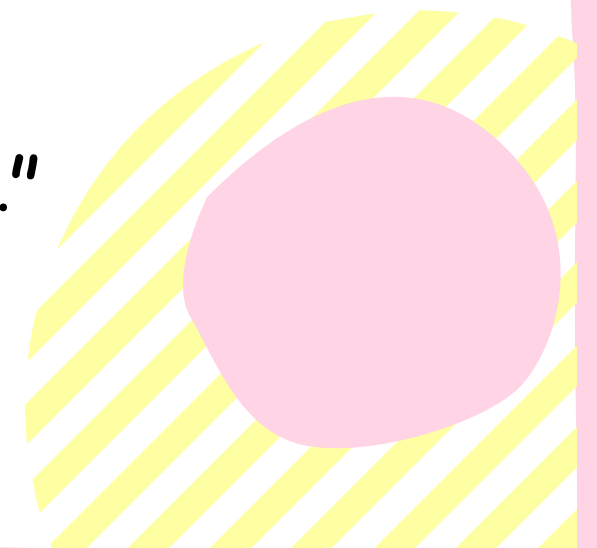
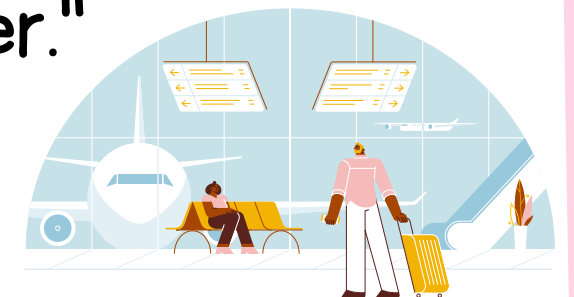

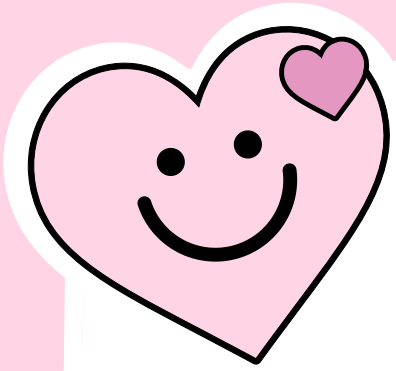
At:

- Usage: "At" is used for specific points related to transportation such as stations or stops.

Under:

- Examples: "The cat is under the car." "There is a bag under the seat."

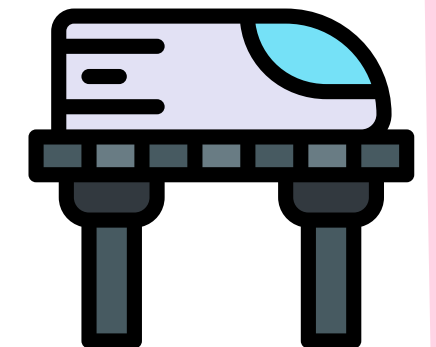

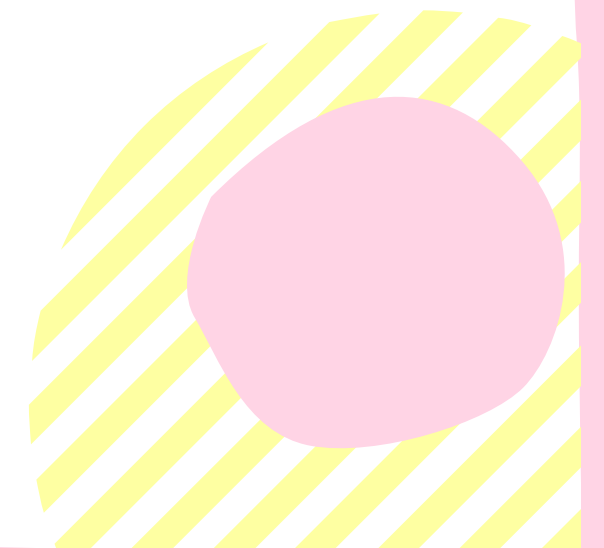
Over:

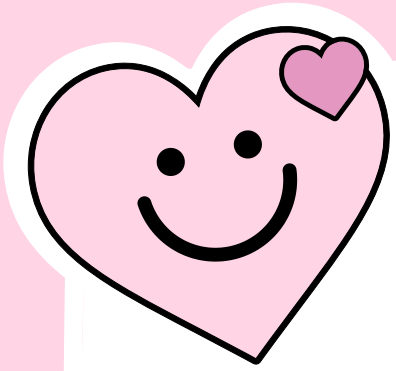
- Usage: "Over" describes movement above a vehicle.

Through:

- Examples: "We drove through the city." "The train goes through the tunnel."
