REWRITE SENTENCES 2

1. Rewrite using the present perfect:

I last saw him two years ago.

2. Rewrite using the past perfect:

We arrived late because the bus left early.

3. Rewrite using going to (future intention):

I've decided that I'll start a new hobby.

4. Rewrite using the first conditional:

I'll call you. I want to let you know the news.

5. Rewrite using the second conditional:

She doesn't have enough time, so she doesn't travel more.

6. Rewrite using the present continuous (future arrangement):

The train will leave at 6 pm.

7. Rewrite using the present simple:

We're meeting the director tomorrow.

8. Rewrite using the past continuous:

I cooked dinner when you called me.

9. Rewrite using the present perfect continuous:

I started studying an hour ago and I'm still studying.

10. Rewrite using the future continuous:

I'll work all evening.

11. Rewrite using the future perfect:

He will finish the project by Friday.
