CHANGE THE SENTENCE

Each sentence contains **one** or **more** mistakes. Rewrite the sentence correctly.

Present Simple → Present Continuous

She works on a new project. (Present Continuous)

They study for their exams. (Present Continuous)

Present Continuous → Present Perfect Continuous

I am learning Japanese. (Present Perfect Continuous)

We are waiting for the results. (Present Perfect Continuous)

Present Perfect → Past Perfect

She has already finished the report before the meeting started. (Past Perfect)

They have left before we arrived. (Past Perfect)

Past Simple → Past Continuous

He read a book when I called him. (Past Continuous)

I cooked dinner at 7 p.m. (Past Continuous)

Past Simple → Present Perfect

I visited Paris three times in my life. (Present Perfect)

She finished the assignment. (Present Perfect)

Future Simple → Future Continuous

This time tomorrow, I will fly to Rome. (Future Continuous)

She will work in the office at 10 a.m. tomorrow. (Future Continuous)

Future Simple → Future Perfect

They will complete the project by Friday. (Future Perfect)

I will write the report before the deadline. (Future Perfect)

Modal Verbs

Rewrite using the modal given

It is possible that he forgot about the meeting. (might)

It wasn't necessary for us to bring any food. (needn't)

I'm certain she was at home last night. (must)

It was a mistake not to apologise. (should)

Modal Perfects

Perhaps they missed the train. (might have)

I'm sure he didn't understand the instructions. (can't have)

It wasn't necessary for her to buy another ticket. (needn't have)

It was a good idea to tell the manager earlier. (should have)

Conditionals

First Conditional

Study hard and you will pass the exam. (If...)

Don't leave now or you'll miss the announcement. (If...)

Second Conditional

I don't know her number, so I can't call her. (If...)

He doesn't exercise, so he isn't very fit. (If...)

Third Conditional

I missed the bus, so I arrived late. (If...)

She didn't revise enough, so she failed the exam. (If...)

Mixed Conditionals

I didn't accept the offer, and now I regret it. (Mixed Conditional)

He didn't study medicine, so he isn't a doctor now. (Mixed Conditional)

Reported Speech

Change into Reported Speech

"I have never been to Scotland," said Mark.

"We are moving house next month," they said.

"I can't attend the meeting tomorrow," she said.

"I finished the project yesterday," said Tom.

Reported Questions

"Where do you work?" she asked me.

"Have you ever visited Ireland?" he asked.

Reporting Verbs

Rewrite using the reporting verb given

"Let's go for a walk," she said. (suggested)

"You should apply for that job," my brother said. (advised)

"I didn't take the money," he said. (denied)

"Please, please help me," she said. (begged)

Gerunds and Infinitives
